PICK: 4 MOTORIOUS
 Winner of 4 races in his last 8 starts. A few of the losses could be explained away. Serious traffic issues in last 2 starts. He was boxed in as the favorite in the G1 BC Turf Sprint. He had handled this turf course quite well in his career. He's 5 for 6 in the money here. Appears to be a very good pace situation for his style. Will be flying home.

VALUE: 7 WHATMAKESSAMMYRUN
 You're able to look past the last start. That was his first race in a very long time and he drew a disadvantageous rail given his style. It forced Dettori to use him to hold an inside position and he tired. He's back on Lasix for this one. A winner 4 times on this turf course. He's been in with some of the best turf runners. Perfect trip likely.

 He ran very well in most of his races last year. The best came with this rider, Fresu, aboard. Whatever went bad in the last race he comes back in this one as a first time gelding. O'Neill has a very decent 6 for 29 record with a comebacker off 6 months or more (21%) with a positive ROI (\$2.51). Has a steady stream of drills for this return.

VALUE: 1 BAD SNEAKERS
 He was even money in the last start and encountered a bit of traffic. He made a slight run to get third well clear of the rest. There was a 50k claim placed on him on that day but it was voided by the vets. It's interesting that he was unprotected in the last start but, despite the loss at even money, is protected today. Saves ground on the rail.

It should set up nicely for this closer. He looks to be quite honest for the level. Baze was on him in two dirt starts and it produced a 10-1 win and a 15-1 runner-up finish.

VALUE: 2 SEATTLE BREAKOUT
 Pretty much pushing all in on the pace collapsing. This is another one of the closers who will wait for things up front to sort themselves out. Forget the last as it doesn't appear he wants the turf. Hopped at the start and very wide two back when facing much better. Isn't all that far off from these and should enjoy a good trip. Value today.

<p>4 – SANTA ANITA (5:05 ET) 71 CINEMA 100K, 1M 1/8 TURF</p> <p>3 BLUE EYED GEORGE 5-2 2 FINAL BOSS 8-5 4 SEA SINGER 8-1 5 BRITISH ISLES 3-1</p> <p>PICK: 3 BLUE EYED GEORGE Louisiana-bred has carved out a nice start to his career. He went for 200k and that is saying something for one from that region. Really like the two starts at TP. Those were underrated races there this winter. The winner of the Battaglia won the Lexington at KEE and 2nd place finisher was 3rd in the G1 Blue Grass. Awful post in last.</p> <p>VALUE: 4 SEA SINGER He beat 11 foes in his last start overseas. He did that at 9-1 in game fashion. Can look past the G3 two back. He broke slowly and ran in place afterwards. The winner is a good one who ran 9th in the Ky Derby. Sib to Isabella Sings, a multiple graded stakes winner on the turf back in 2017. Really bred for these longer distance turf races.</p> <p>A) 3 B) 2,4,5 C) 1 D)</p>	<p>5 – SANTA ANITA (5:38 ET) 78 OPTIONAL CLAIMING 55K, 1M DIRT</p> <p>4 ULTIMATE GAMBLE 9-5 7 SMART MO 3-1 2 COALINGA ROAD 5-1 6 GHAZAALY 6-1</p> <p>PICK: 4 ULTIMATE GAMBLE 4YO colt sold for \$1.75M back in 2022. He's run pretty well in each of his starts. Winner of the debut won the G1 American Pharoah next and then was second in the G1 BC Juvenile. Appeared to have needed the race last out off the layoff. He lost a lot of ground on the far turn going very wide. Should move forward in 2nd off the shelf.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 COALINGA ROAD 7YO gelding has run on both turf and dirt. He's handled the dirt just fine with 10 in the money from 12 starts on the main track. Nice 3rd last time on dirt in a 100k stake at LRC. That track can be tough for horses to really get a handle on, too. Rispoli off another in the race to stay with this one. He was stymied in early stretch and had to angle out. Once clear he ran with the top two the rest of the way but was just outfinished (both trained by D'Amato). Certainly in capable hands for a distance race of this type. Looks like the one to beat in this spot.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 ROCKEMPEROR 8YO went from the top turf trainer on the East Coast to the top turf trainer on the West Coast prior to the last start. Hard to tell if he has the Chad Brown form based on the last start. He was boxed in for most of the stretch and couldn't really find room to move. <p>7 – SANTA ANITA (6:38 ET) 45 MAIDEN SPECIAL WEIGHT 54K, 5F DIRT</p> <p>6 KEEP DANCIN NICK 8-1 7 CHARMZ AWAY 5-2 2 IT'S THIRSTY TIME 12-1 3 GO GO PRANCER 4-1</p> <p>PICK: 6 KEEP DANCIN NICK There were two 4.5F MSW races for 2YO's on May 3 at Santa Anita. One was the race this one is coming out of and the other (four races later) for Cal-bred fillies. This heat was 1 2/5 seconds faster than the one for the fillies on that day. At least this one was passing them late. Deep in the female line is undefeated champ Personal Ensign.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 IT'S THIRSTY TIME This trainer was in the money in 5 of his last 7 with a 1st time 2YO sprinting in MSW at Santa Anita on the dirt (1 winner). The odds of those in the money were 8-5 (the winner), 7-2, 6-1, 17-1, 20-1. This one cost 65k last year. The last debut 2YO sprinting in a MSW for this trainer was 2 weeks ago. The best of those efforts came when Gonzalez let him roll on the lead. That didn't happen in the last 3 starts but expect Ruis to have the rider send today. Been in the money in 7 of 9 on this turf. Trainer has spotted them pretty well in 2024 (17% winners). 6YO will need to be caught in here.</p> <p>VALUE: 10 HACKING IT UP Drew the 11 post and added front wraps in the last start and it was a disaster. That prompted a long layoff. Has a pretty decent worktab for the return and draws one of the top riders at the track. Stakes winner in the spring last year at Golden Gate. Take note that he only raced under 50k claiming in two of those maidens and he won once and was second a head in other. Really lost all chance with a bad stumble at the start in the last race. Might appreciate this level. Will save ground here.</p> <p>VALUE: 2 MOBE TOWN He is a speedball who beat the top choice four back at 2-5 odds when he went wire to wire. Was claimed out of that race and finally moved back to the dirt in the last one on the class drop and was unlucky to lose. He'll be winging it out front once again and they often are hard to run down at the lower levels. Must use in the exotics.</p> <p>A) 1,2,8 B) 5,6 C) 3,4,7 D)</p>

PICK: 7 SHE'Z THE LAW She seems the most logical winner of this race. Her two turf starts were both very good. Caught a tough race two back. Top two finishers both won next out. Winner took an allowance and runner-up won a MSW. 4 th stepped in with winners and was second at 6-1 in opt clm next time out. Female line of '16 G1 La Brea winner Constellaion.	PICK: 4 IGNATOWSKI Cost just 30k back in 2022 so the drop after three tries in MSW company makes sense. Well-beaten in what was a strong MSW last out. 1 st , 2 nd and 4 th all came back to win next out. Has a sibling who won 240k but all was on the grass. He's had some trouble breaking cleanly from the gate. Had front wraps added last out so check betting.	PICK: 11 FATHER DELAY They claimed him for 35k in his second start and have won twice since (both times ridden by Mike Smith). Did not get a good ride in the last start when he was allowed to run up on heels from the rail and lost momentum. He draws perfectly wide and gets Smith back. Should be a fast enough pace to be able to catch wobbly-legged leaders.			
VALUE: 9 KELLY'S OUT Sire was a multiple Group 1 winner in Europe going long distances. His dam, Ouija Board, won \$6.3M, 7 G1's, the F&M BC Turf twice and was 3 rd in the Group 1 Arc in '04. A little bit flat late in the last start but think the pace will flatter her style a bit more today. Expect Smith to take her farther back and try to run them down in the late stages.	VALUE: 2 TOO WILD TO TAME In the last 5 years, this trainer is 7 for 36 (19%) with a first timer sprinting on dirt in maiden claiming. Winners odds were 35-1, 18-1, 11-1, 8-1, 9-2, 7-2, 6-5. One of those winners was the only runner he had for this owner. 4YO has had starts and stops in the works so it is a bit of a guess. Certainly not facing any world beaters today.	VALUE: 12 SEISMIC SPIRIT Hasn't run a bad ran in this country. Two of the three off the board runs were close 4 th place finishes. The other was in the Windsor Castle at Ascot. Miller has a 38% win percentage in turf sprints for this ownership (3 different horses were winners). The wide post is usually not much of a problem at this distance. Will be a very decent price.
